PASTOR'S CORNER



Our church is having a Christian Family Day this month. As followers of Christ, we believe in sharing our faith with others so they, too, can experience God's love. We have many missions and ministries to help others and show our commitment to our beliefs through service. We also wear our Zion's Maxatawny shirts to events and restaurants, letting others know about our faith and active church

The 2023 Annual Reports should be available the beginning of March. The reports will be available at the church or call the church office and one can be mailed to you.




SOUP SUPPERS AND LENTEN SERVICES

HELPING HAND FUND

On March 10th, baskets will be available in the back of the church and the Gathering Area for any donations to the Helping Hand Fund. The Helping Hand Fund was established to provide financial support for individuals in the congregation or non-members who may be experiencing unexpected challenges in their lives. Contributions received go to replenish the fund. This confidential fund is administered by the pastor; in the absence of a pastor the board president will make decisions based on the nature of the request. It is hoped that funds donated will be replaced in the future by persons receiving the assistance.

STREET MEDICINE TEAM

The Plastic Bag Group is partnering with Valley Health Partners (VHP) Street Medicine Team which focuses its efforts on unsheltered persons living outside and does outreach to those persons 4-5 days out of the work week. Clinics are also offered at eight designated centers, soup kitchens, and homeless shelters. Street medicine serves all patients regardless of insurance status or ability to pay. The Plastic Bag team would like to support the Street Medicine Team not only by donating our mats but also by collecting some of the other items on their wish lists. Items will be collected **through March 10**th. A collection bin is located in the Gathering Area for any items you would like to donate.
