THE PASTOR'S PAGE

epistle that he wrote to the early Christians, many of whom were huddled in fear throughout the Roman Empire where they were being severely persecuted. Right now we are facing some fearful times in our own lives as we hear every latest news report about the rise and spread of the coronavirus. And Paul's words are a reminder of why we are people of faith—because God has given us true peace that can only come from above. As Jesus promised his disciples at the most trying time of his life, the Last Supper: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid" (John 14:27).

As is often the case, Jesus' divine advice and guidance is not always easy for us mortals to heed. I know many of you are worried and troubled right now. And, sad to say, the cancellation of our recent worship services may have brought you additional worry. At a time when many of you may have been looking for some peace and continuity in your lives by coming to our beautiful sanctuary to worship and have fellowship, you found that even your church was closed. I know this has been very disappointing to some of you. So, I would like to address why Zion's Church has taken this step and what our plans are for the weeks ahead.

First of all, I want you to know that this decision was made by our Church Board and was not made lightly. While some disagreed, it was the decision of the majority to cancel our services. Personally, I trust that the Holy Spirit guided the members of our Board to the right decision. As a vital part of our community, it was the right thing for our church to follow the advice and guidelines of our national and local leaders. When it was decided to close all schools in Pennsylvania, it would have been rather irresponsible to keep our doors open and perhaps exacerbate the problem, when we want above all to take every possible step to curtail the problem.

Unlike some churches who have already cancelled for several weeks ahead, we are going to make this a week-by-week decision in the hope that things might turn around sooner rather than later. So please check either on WFMZ.com (under snow emergency closings) or call the church office (610-683-7485) where you will hear a message about whether we will be holding services. Please know that I plan to be in the office Monday through Thursday if anyone wants to talk or is in need of prayer. Please do not hesitate to stop. That being said, I also want to make everyone aware that even clergy are being

restricted from visiting hospitals and nursing homes, except in the event of death. Following that guideline, we are also going to cancel the Home Communion visits from our Eucharistic Ministry Team this month. Hopefully we can resume next month.

While we wait for this pandemic to ease (and it most certainly will — Wuhan province where it all began is now experiencing almost no new cases), let us all strive to be a non-anxious presence in a time when so many are anxious. And, in the meantime, please remember that though we are being called as a nation to practice "social distancing," for Christians that is not the same as "spiritual distancing." While we may have to maintain some social distance, we do not have to be spiritually apart from each other. We can still phone each other, send cards or e-mails, and keep each other, especially our shut-in and older members, in our prayers. And please do not hesitate to stop to see me at the office or give me a call to talk. I am here if anyone needs anything. And always remember, as our Conference Minister, Bill Worley has reminded us pastors: As Christians were are people of *faith*, not fear.

"For God has not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." (2 Timothy 1:7)

St. James, Pitman: Rural and Vibrant



St. James, Pitman, is a very rural congregation that maintains a vibrant ministry of outreach, Christian education, worship, and social ministry. The congregation recently dedicated its new ADA accessible restrooms and wheelchair lift with Bishop Zeiser and a packed house in attendance. The new restroom and wheelchair lift became a reality after the congregation received a significant bequest from a former member's estate. Making the building accessible was the logical way to open the doors and welcome in the community.

Each year, the congregation, which has 150 baptized members, crafts and ships nearly 200 quilts to Lutheran World Relief sites around the world. Locally, St. James raises thousands of dollars to help people within the community, while meeting its benevolence tithe to our Synod. When Bishop Zeiser learned that the quilts were shipped to places like Madagascar, Tanzania, and Indonesia, he said, "some people may think you're 'in the middle of nowhere', but for the people receiving the work of your hands you are very much somewhere."

The congregation's vision of reaching out and being a welcoming place has already borne fruit. The quilting group, open to anyone in the community, now has its largest membership ever and the quilt production has taken off. As word about the accessibility project has spread in the community, worship attendance has risen as well. For a little church 'in the middle of nowhere', many more are finding that it is really somewhere to be.

St. Paul, Fountain Hill, NFL Canned Food Challenge Award

The Bethlehem-Easton Mission District Council challenged their congregations to participate in collecting canned goods for the food bank(s) of their choice. It was an effort to join forces; and with a bit of a challenge, to help others.

The goal was to collect a canned good for each point scored during the playoffs! Yes, that meant each congregation was asked to collect 523 cans. The prize was not revealed to the congregations ahead of time.

The suspense grew from week to week as the scores piled up and the cans were counted. Who would win the prize? As the points total grew, it seemed like an unreachable goal; yet many remained hopeful and determined.

After 11 play-off games, watching their canned goods pile up at their altar each week to be counted, St. Paul Fountain Hill was honored to receive a framed award for their "Mighty Effort" in the NFL Canned Food Challenge by surpassing the goal as they collected a total of 594 items. A total of 2,279 cans were collected & distributed to several food banks within the district.

Yes, the "Mighty 45" (as their Pastoral Care Provider Marlene Werkheiser calls them) stepped up to the challenge! As she told the them that first week, "This is a great way for our small congregation to help others and to possibly win bragging rights to the prize. "The challenge intrigued them enough to muster up an average of 13 cans per worshipping parishioner.

"I am beyond proud of them", said Werkheiser. "For a small congregation, they really wanted to show others that their congregation can (and wants to) participate in ministries that help to do God's work."
