## THE PASTOR'S PAGE



Recently, on the Sunday called The Baptism of Our Lord, we heard the famous story of Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan River, and we all had the opportunity to remember our own baptisms, reaffirm our baptismal promises, and recommit ourselves to the ministry of Christ and his church.

In our gospel reading that day, we heard John tell the crowds who had come to him to be baptized, "I baptize you with water, but one who is more powerful than I is coming . . . He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."

We who have been baptized in Christ can lay claim to the greatest power in the universe—the power of the Holy Spirit. We were given that power at our baptism. Just before his ascension to heaven, Jesus promised to give this power to his disciples: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

But you might ask, if we are given such great power when we are baptized, why do Christians so often come across like 98-pound weaklings on the beach? Perhaps it is because so few of us have learned how to tap into the power of the Holy Spirit and unleash it in our lives.

In order to let the power of the Holy Spirit work in our lives, we need to *exercise* that power. Like body builders who do power lifting, we need to practice "power living." Just as serious athletes commit a portion of time every day to toning their muscles and increasing their endurance, Spirit-powered Christians need to get into a daily regimen to keep the power of the Holy Spirit flowing in our lives. We need to get "pumped up" with the power of the Holy Spirit. To paraphrase those Arnold Schwarzenegger imitators, Hans and Franz from *Saturday Night Live*, God wants to "pump you up."

So, I would like to offer you a three-step spiritual exercise that will bring forth the latent power of the Holy Spirit that was given to all of us at our baptism, but which too often lies dormant and unused. Here are three simple exercises you can do every day to pump yourself up with the power of the Holy Spirit:

- 1) **Practice daily alignment with God.** Just getting together with God for one hour on a Sunday morning isn't enough. Spirit-powered living requires that we systematically turn to God every day. The more we practice being with God in prayer and the more we intentionally seek to encounter God in every moment, the more we will begin to recognize that Gods' power does indeed surround us and sustain us every moment of every day. If an athlete doesn't work out regularly, his or her muscles soon get flabby. And the same is true of our spiritual muscles.

- 2) **Practice daily self-reflection.** Athletes know that isometric exercises—those that push our muscles against each other—are the exercises that build tremendous strength as well as tremendous elasticity and flexibility. For Christians, Spirit-powered living turns the power of the Holy Spirit inward as well as outward, creating deep reserves of energy and limitless peace within us. What we need to do in practicing daily self-reflection is look inward at ourselves to scrutinize the motives and intentions behind all our words and deeds. The more we practice daily self-reflection, the more the power of the Holy Spirit will inform and influence our every action.
- 3) **Daily embodiment.** Daily embodiment is Spirit-powered living put into action. The Spirit that God gave us at our baptism can't be selfishly kept to ourselves. This power needs to be let loose in the world in order to have its greatest and most beneficial effect. The real power and strength of the Holy Spirit can only be activated through regular service to others.

A daily regimen of these three spiritual exercises—spending daily time with God, engaging in daily self-reflection, and daily embodiment of our faith—will turn the dormant power of the Holy Spirit into true super-power in our lives. If we faithfully do these three exercises we will discover the latent “super-powers” that were given to us by God at our baptism. We will have the power to think more clearly, feel more deeply, speak more truthfully, love more extravagantly, serve more creatively, give more lavishly, and live more fully.

Like mild-mannered Clark Kent who is secretly Superman, Christians have a secret super-power as well—the power of the Holy Spirit. But let's not keep that power a secret. Let's get spiritually “pumped up” and openly and forcefully use the Spirit's power every day.

# CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

Congregational meeting was held December 13, 2015 after service. Called to order at 11:35 A.M. by Steve O'Neil, Church Board President. Eighty three voting members in attendance.

Budget presented to members by Ben Haas.

Finance committee forecasted the 2016 budget as presented recognizing that many variables are present such as heating, electricity, etc. Discussion regarding concerns of the monies being transferred to cover deficits in operating costs. Acknowledged that there has been a negative balance but the investments over the past five years have performed very well and able to meet this need. The investments have gained nearly \$160,000 in interest over the five periods after the transfers. Motion made to accept the budget as presented by Dale Grim. Motion seconded by John Perella. Motion passed unanimously by congregation.

Updates to Safe Kids Policy presented by Lisa Bartera.

Updates to original policy that was passed in 2009. Changes include screening clearances (ChildLine, PATCH, and FBI) now to be required for the volunteer staff such as vacation bible school teachers, Sunday school teachers, and youth group leaders. Screening to be conducted every three years rather than five in previous policy. Motion to accept the proposed changes made by Traci Gehring, seconded by Ray Wiltrout. Motion passed unanimously.

Merger plan presented by Greg Haas.

The merger of the two corporations (Lutheran and UCC corporations) into one Zion's Union corporation. Motion to accept the merger plan as presented made by Dottie Moyer. Seconded by Dale Grim. Motion passed unanimously.

Election of new church board members.

Board members completing their terms (Elaine Silliman, Karen Howard, Ellie Merkel & Jackie Ziegler) were thanked for their service. Church Board Members seeking election presented, John Perella, LaRee Fegely, Peggy Morgan, Enos Bleiler. No additional members nominated. Motion to close nominations and vote as a single vote made by Dottie Moyer. Seconded by Dale Grim. Motion passed unanimously. Motion to accept the board members as presented made by Carl Flicker. Seconded by Loretta Flicker. Motion passed unanimously

Adjournment of Congregational Meeting.

Motion made by Randy Warmkessel and seconded by Tara Berger. Motion passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 11:55 A.M.
