PASTOR'S CORNER



Friends of Zion's Union Maxatawny,

This month we started ministry together. As I reflect on what the search committee has shared with me, what has been shared in brief conversations as I have had the privilege of

meeting some of you, and what I have gleamed from your other services I have seen online, I sense a mixture of extreme excitedness, but also a little weariness to let go of what has been known to be "church" for the past several years.

It reminds me of a prophet, maybe you know the one – Moses – who was hesitant to follow God's call to lead, actually coming up with multiple scenarios where things could go wrong whilst he stood in front of the burning bush (Exodus 3). And, it also reminds me of my dog who goes by the same name.

You see, I recently got Moses, my dog, not the prophet, some new treats. And he would cry and run away with his treats still in his mouth. This concerned me because Moses is a small dog and I thought he was maybe having a hard time holding onto these new treats because they were bigger. But, what I found out after some online sleuthing (thanks, Google!) was that a dog who cries with a treat in their mouth is actually showing happiness. Since they can't talk, their perceived cries are actually sounds of happiness.

Moses was crying because he was so excited about his new treat and didn't want to put it down - he didn't want anyone (being me, I guess) to steal it. Moses, the prophet on the other hand, wanted to lay down all of his excuses so he wouldn't have to try something new and be a leader of the Israelites.

We know Moses the prophet eventually followed God's call, as the resistant prophets in the Bible tended to eventually. And, my dog Moses learned I wouldn't steal his treats, no matter how tempting they may be. Moses the prophet entered into ministry hesitantly. And my dog Moses still finds places to hide the treats I give him.

Perhaps our ministry here is similar to how both Moseses responded. We are hesitant, but excited. We can try new things, but we won't always want to share how we're feeling about them.

I want to encourage each of you, as we enter into this new phase of ministry together – to give yourselves permission to have fun with the Spirit. To lean in where you might be hesitant. To not hide when you might be afraid, or excited about something – but to share it openly. It is through this sharing – of the many joys, worries, hopes, and fears – that we can begin to see where God is calling us.

Our congregation generously gave to Mission Support



Love for the Least

The Global Missions Team at the Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit, Emmaus, PA, led an advent appeal this past holiday season to support the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) at Arusha Lutheran Medical Center in Tanzania, which was established by ELCA medical missionary Dr. Mark Jacobson, and also had the opportunity to lead the church's worship services on their annual Global Missions Sunday, held this year on January 22, 2023, to share about this ministry with those in attendance.

When a baby is born prematurely in Tanzania, it is considered as good as dead. Premature babies there are often referred to as 'stillbirths.' This was not acceptable to the staff of Arusha Lutheran Medical Center. Fifteen years ago they began to offer neonatal intensive care, and pediatrician Dr. Steve Swanson joined the program in 2011. Initially they were only able to save 4% of the babies. Today they serve almost 400 babies annually, and the survival rate in 2022 was 92%.

The care at the Arusha Lutheran Medical Center NICU is the best in Tanzania, and in most of East Africa. No baby is turned away because of inability to pay or insurance status. The five doctors and 26 nurses who staff the NICU do not just care for the tiny infants, but for the parents as well. A hospital bed and meals are provided to every mother with a baby in the NICU and both parents are encouraged and coached on how to interact with their babies.

Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit raised \$3,785 from their Love for the Least appeal to be directed to the Arusha Lutheran Medical Center NICU in Tanzania, and 175 preemie knit or crochet hats were lovingly crafted for the NICU infants, which they hope to send to Tanzania. These hats can save lives by helping to keep the babies warm.
