## THE PASTOR'S PAGE



Have the events of the past year left you feeling overwhelmed? Do you feel confident about what lies ahead this year, or do you feel apprehensive, maybe even scared? With the Coronavirus lock-down forcing us to "shelter in place" and not being able to attend

church or gather with family at holidays, combined with all the tragedy and chaos that always seems to be happening in the world, many of us may feel completely overwhelmed. When we look at the headlines, we might feel overwhelmed to the point of asking, "Where is God?" However, no matter what is going on in our lives or in the world around us, we Christians have a peculiar sort of logic that dares to proclaim, all evidence to the contrary, that Jesus reigns and that God is at work defeating the forces of evil in the world.

British theologian David Ford has called our age the "age of overwhelmedness." Ford says that we have been so exposed by the media to worldwide tragedies—things our ancestors were largely unaware of—that we are emotionally overwhelmed. Wars and terrorist attacks and natural disasters, which in a previous age were only heard of vaguely and after the fact, have now become our daily diet right in our living room. Add to the problems of the world all the problems we face in our own nation and in our own lives and it is no wonder we feel overwhelmed. Our problems often seem so large and resistant to our efforts to overcome them. We may sometimes wonder where we can ever find the strength to keep going on in life.

I'd like to suggest that we can find the strength, courage, and hope we need in the same place that St. John did when he wrote the book of Revelation. St. John was the bishop, or overseer, of seven churches in Asia Minor (modern day Turkey) at the end of the first century. These young churches were facing extremely hard times as the Roman Empire was stepping up its persecution of Christians. They, too, could not worship together. This was the time when Christians were beginning to be fed to the lions and used as human torches to light the emperor's gardens. St. John himself was a prisoner on the island of Patmos, the Alcatraz of its day. John could have been easily overwhelmed by the great troubles that he and his churches faced. Yet, he begins a letter to his persecuted churches with a remarkable statement of hope and affirmation:

"Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come . . . from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To him who loves us and freed us from our sins by his blood . . . to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen." (Revelation 1:4-6)

John responded to the overwhelming evil all around him with an exuberant, confident affirmation of the power of God! That is what John also called his persecuted churches to do. And that is what God still calls all Christians to do today. We are to come to church, in the midst of all the trouble around us, to offer our worship and praise. We are to respond to the overwhelming forces of evil with an affirmation of the triumphant power of God. For we Christians know, as no one else can, that Jesus Christ reigns and that all the enemies of God will ultimately be defeated and that good will one day have the last word over evil and death. That is the Easter faith we just recently celebrated and continue to proclaim throughout this Easter season.

And that is why we come to worship (be it in-person or virtually). We join together in worship in order to strengthen each other in an affirmation of God's goodness and power. We join our voices in one great affirmation when in our Holy Communion liturgy we proclaim, "This is the feast of victory for our God!" As Christians we believe that God's love *will* triumph. And that firm belief is what enables us to go on in an "age of overwhelmedness." It is what enables us to bring another child into the world, when so many are afraid of what the future will hold for our children. Thanks be to God, we Christians know what the future holds. Through Jesus Christ we know that God's kingdom has begun on earth and its future fulfillment cannot be defeated!

Looking to the future in the hope and expectation that only Christ can give,
