EXCITING NEWS

On September 8th, we were able to pay off our Organ Restoration Loan at Fleetwood Bank, having paid Emery Brothers at an earlier date for the restoration. Now all debts regarding the Organ project have been paid. Thank you to the Finance Committee for using our investments wisely, to the memorials designated for this purpose, and for the generous donors who contributed these past few years. Envelopes are still available if anyone is interested is donating funds to replace the money used from Zion's other resources that were used to pay earlier costs before donations were enough.

LANDSCAPING PROJECT UPDATE

The total cost for this project was \$4,049.99. All monies to pay this came from Memorials and Donations for a total of \$4,595.25. The extra funds will be used at a later date for mulch and/or future plant purchases.

SOUND SYSTEM PROJECT UPDATE

The total cost for this project was \$11,644.86. Donation of \$5,000, Memorials totaling \$3,625, and church account funds of \$3,019.86 were used to pay this upgrade.

NEIGHBORS IN NEED

States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. NIN grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. The 2023 NIN campaign will focus on economic justice issues.

Items to include in a Shoebox

*Pack a shoe box for either a GIRL or BOY that is age appropriate (2-4, 5-9, or 10-14 years of age). All items should be new. Include items like:

Personal Care: comb/brush/compact mirror, toothbrush, washcloth, adhesive bandages, reusable cups/plates/water bottles/bowls/blunt utensils, non-liquid lip balm, nail clipper/file, washable/reusable menstrual pads, stick deodorant, flashlights (with extra batteries)

Clothing/Accessories: socks, hat/scarf/mittens, sunglasses, wristwatch/bracelet, hair accessories, sunglasses, bandana

Crafts/Activities: coloring book/crayons, watercolor set, building blocks, playdoh, stickers, paper, puzzles, small tool set, compass, sewing kit, gardening kit (gloves/trowel-No Seeds), playing cards, work gloves, binoculars

School: pencils/cases/manual sharpeners, colored pencils/pens, markers, picture books, notebooks, glue stick/tape, solar calculators

Toys: Foam balls, finger puppets, slinky, play cars/boats/trucks, plastic tools, plastic toys & action figures (dinosaurs), harmonica, yo-yo, jump rope, small Etch-A-Sketch, kaleidoscope, marbles, playing cards, hacky sack, playing cards

Our October volunteer is dedicated to enhancing the church property both inside and outdoors.

She grew up living in a trailer on her grandparent's farm in Birdsboro, PA. with a single parent mom and a brother two years older than her. Aunt, Uncle, Grammy, Pop-Walton style. Was most often found out in the barn with the animals. "Bubba" was her name in her neighborhood gang of boys; she did everything with them - fishing, riding bikes, football, baseball - until "I was 14 years old and they discovered girls".

She played alto saxophone in High School and was in marching, concert, and pep bands. (first chair) Only played solos if she could remain seated and be anonymous. Graduated from Twin Valley HS where she was in the National Honor Society and in top ten of her class. Went to Community General Hospital, Reading, for X-ray School and Lancaster Hospital-Ultrasound School.

Her first car was a metallic, purple, Chevy Nova, with a broken heater, traveling home from school with cold air blasting from the defroster, and riding home with mittens off and on again. Her exhaust pipe broke; she was dragging it home with sparks flying. Always prepared for disaster, she untwisted a metal hanger to tie it up.

She met her husband at age 18 in x-ray school. Marriage took place 33 years ago in the Allentown Court House with a JP at noon on a Wednesday; there were no witnesses and no rings. Lunch at Widow Brown's on the way home followed. He mowed the lawn when they arrived home; they worked the rest of the week and no one knew they had married. The honeymoon was in Cancun the following week, telling their parents after they got back.

She worked at Lehigh Valley Hospital for 33 years as an ultrasound technician and clinical instructor. Her two children include a daughter and a married son. Pets are a dog and cat. Likes to visit Longwood Gardens, hike, garden and do puzzles. Church involvement includes decorating (doesn't decorate at home), former board member, Seeders and Sow On, Mission Outreach, Personnel, Property (helper), and Disaster Committees, and candle filler.

She raised pet geese, Wilbur and Orville, until her Grammy served them for Thanksgiving dinner. Her name is spelled four different ways in the high school yearbook. She worked on weekends at the family sawmill, receiving a Dusty Road Sundae in payment.
